<u>MONITORING & MEASUREMENT REPORTS</u> <u>AT PLANNED INTERVALS</u>

- 1. Health History Card maintained always
- 2. Medical registers & documents upto-date as per statute
- 3. Interaction with rural folks at planned intervals
- 4. Follow-up advice during re-check-up
- 5. Preventive Health Check-ups.

SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT(2017-18)

- 1. Total of 7102 patients(monthly average of 591) were attended at Health Centre during the year, who were examined, medical advice provided and medicines administered free of cost.
- 2. Total 144 under-privileged students were medically examined free-of-cost.
- 2. Total of 204 cases were given minor surgical treatment, including stitching/dressing.
- 3. Total of 164 serious patients were sent to different referral hospitals at Tangi and Cuttack 97 patients to SCB MCH, 51 patients to Tangi CHC and 16 to other centres) due to their critical nature of illness thro' RSB Mobile Clinic free of cost.

- 4. Every patient issued with Health History Card to keep track of chronology of illness with vital health parameters recorded during every check-up.
- 5. Ambulance travelled total distance of 8337 kms during the period ferrying serious and emergency cases.
- 6. Mobile Medical Unit travelled total distance of 125 kms carrying highly critical cases to admit patients at SCB MCH & CHC, Tangi.
- 7. **Proactive track of his medical history of chronic cases**
- 8. Scores of lives saved by timely medical treatment.

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9. Ambulance well maintained with a dedicated drivers, devoid of break-down, by timely servicing and back-up.
